SECTION 1: INTRODUCTION

The Ho Technical University (HTU) Learning Management System (LMS), referred to as HTU LMS, is a Moodle-based platform dedicated to e-learning activities. This LMS will provide you with a wide variety of opportunities, resources, and new strategies for technical education and training.

LMS's have become an integral teaching and learning methodology since the outbreak of the Covid-19 global pandemic. This is achieved using Information and Communication Technology (ICT), in particular web-based education and training to the maximum possible extent.

The purpose of this document is to make potential users familiar with HTU LMS and its basic functions to facilitate proper and smooth use of these e-learning tools. This customized manual describes just essential functions and regular resources which users need for optimal performance.

The manual explains how to use/operate LMS being it a “teacher” and “student” user type. The manual is divided into two chapters reflecting functions, options, and tools of each user type. Particular attention should be given to the chapter with instructions on how to get started using the site/platform and other chapters describing how to perform each operation once you have managed to log in.

Types of Users in HTU LMS

There are 3 main types of LMS users with an additional user type that is rarely used in the HTU LMS:

- **Students:** who have access to the materials and activities made available on the site/platform for facilitating learning by the teacher or the person who created the course content.
- **Teachers:** also known as professors, instructors, lecturers, or evaluators, who are responsible for developing content and activities and delivering the course.
 - *Editing Teachers* have full rights to run the course including changing the activities and grading students
 - *Non-editing Teachers* can teach in courses and grade students, but may not alter activities.
- **Administrator,** who is responsible for system functionality and administers access rights, keys, passwords, courses that are created, etc.
- **Guests** have minimal privileges and usually cannot enter text anywhere. They only can enter a course only if it is an open course.

System Requirements

The following are the requirements for the

- A Computer with an internet browser such as Mozilla Firefox, Microsoft Internet Explorer, Google Chrome, etc.;
- Cookies activated;
- Java and JavaScript enabled;
- Pop-up windows enabled;
- Internet connection;
- Sufficient memory to download and open web content such as images and videos;
- Speakers to listen to sounds;(if dealing with Audio-visuals)
- PDF Reader (for opening PDF files.)

Supporting Languages

HTU LMS allows setting up a course structure in several languages as per additional request. Some of the available languages include English, German, French, Chinese etc.

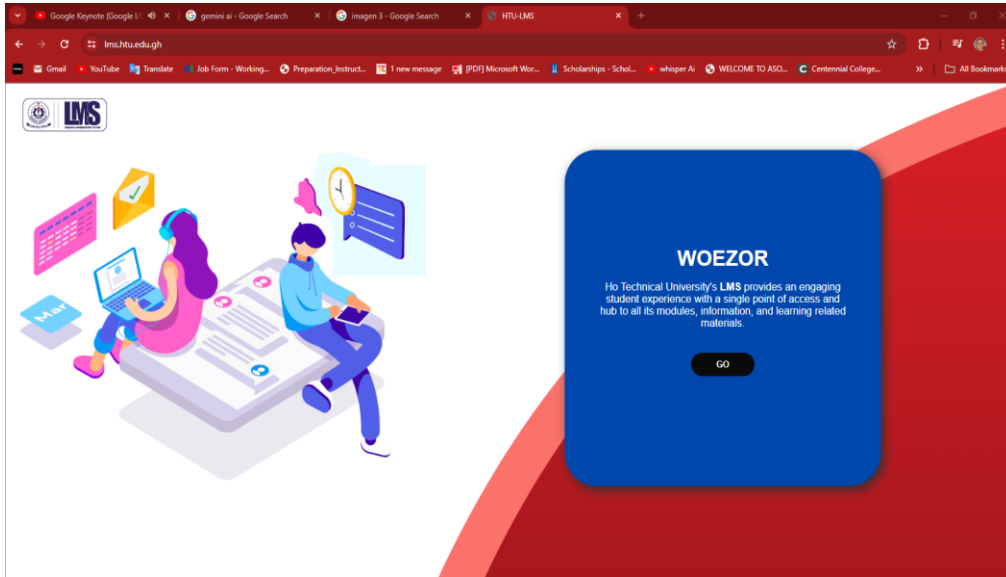
Accessing the system, logging in and editing profile

The HTU LMS platform can be accessed via the following means:

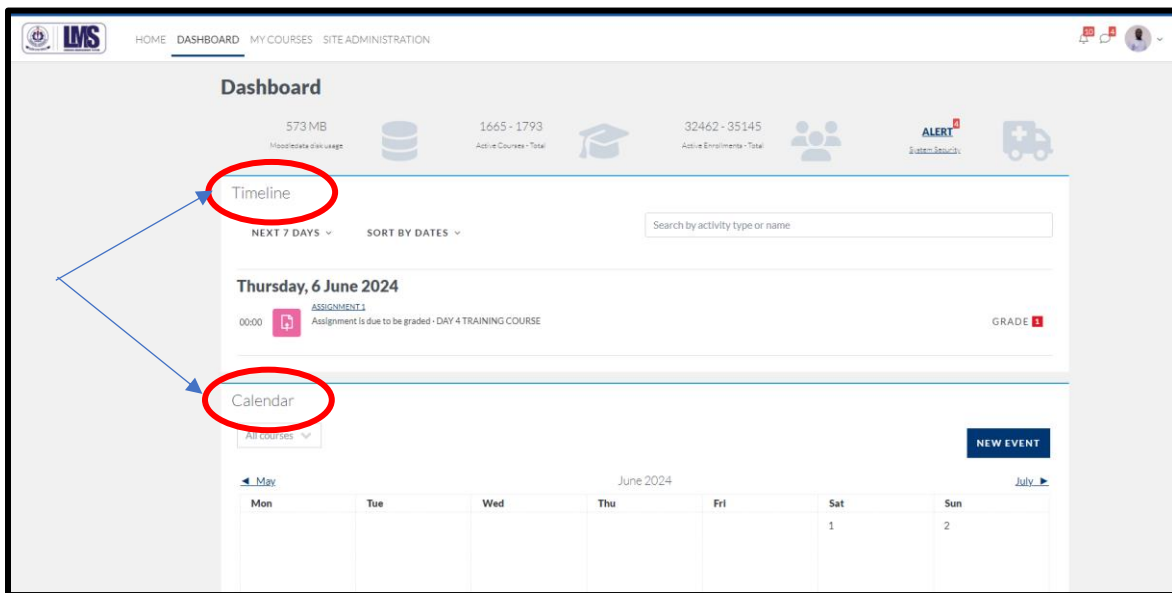

DASHBOARD TOUR

The Moodle dashboard is the first landing page that opens after logging into Moodle and is used to navigate between courses and key pages.

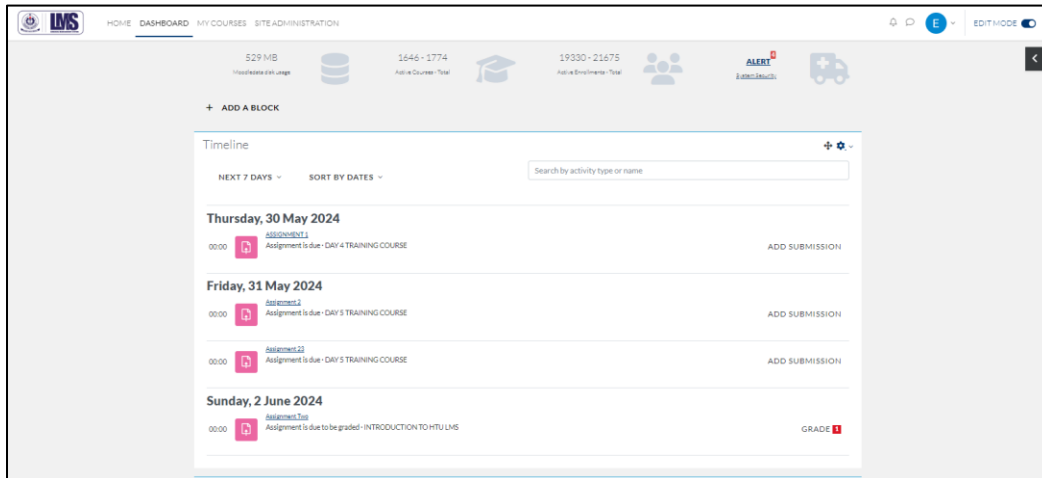
The redesign focuses on visual improvements and user experience, presenting users with a personal view of upcoming Moodle activities from all courses, an improved calendar, and a simple Design.



The two main things found on the Dashboard are the Timelines and Calendar.

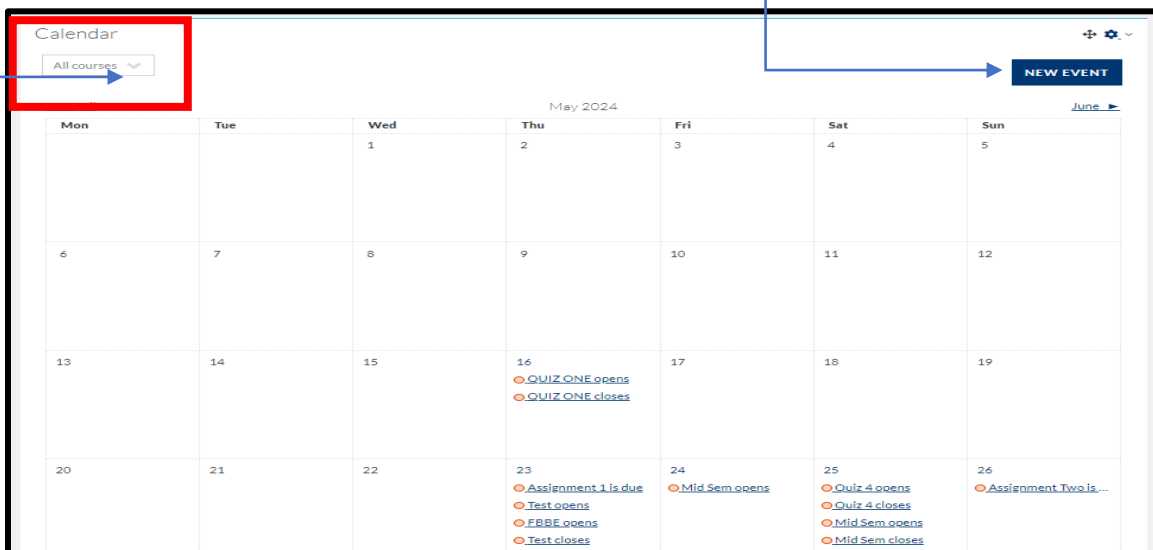
Timeline

The Timeline can be accessed by scrolling down while on the Dashboard of the LMS. The Timeline block provides an overview of activities with deadlines in your enrolled courses. Activities with a set deadline OR 'Expect completed on' activity completion settings will appear in the Timeline and Calendar blocks. Activities without deadlines or external to Moodle will not appear here. Please advise students to refer to the course outline for a holistic view of assessment due dates. Courses and activities that have been hidden or restricted from students will not appear in the Timeline or Calendar blocks.



Calendar

The Calendar displays activities that have activity completion requirements enabled by teaching staff. Additionally, new events can be **added** to the calendar with a press of a button. 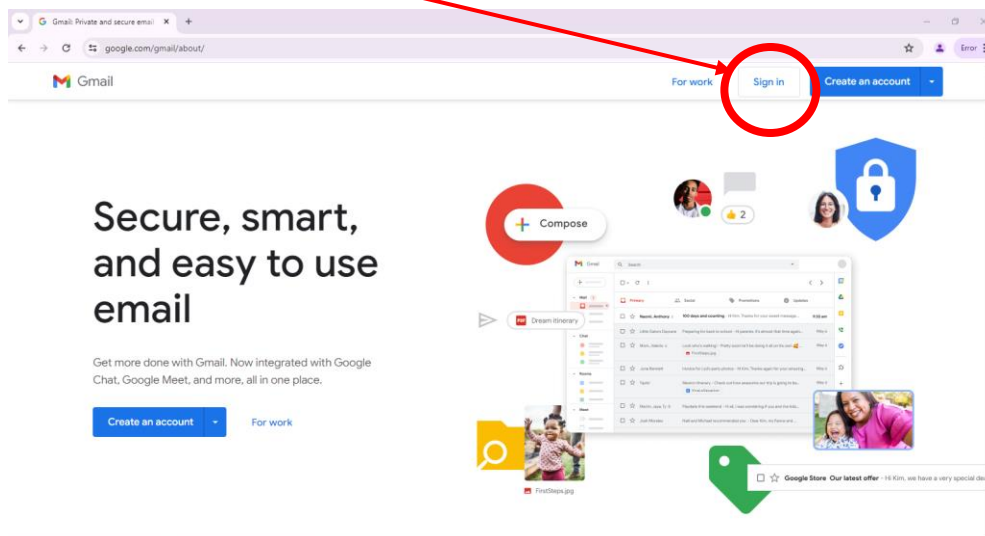
How do I log into the HTU LMS?

To access the HTU LMS as a student, there are two main processes to go through;

1. First login into your Student Email
2. Login to HTU LMS

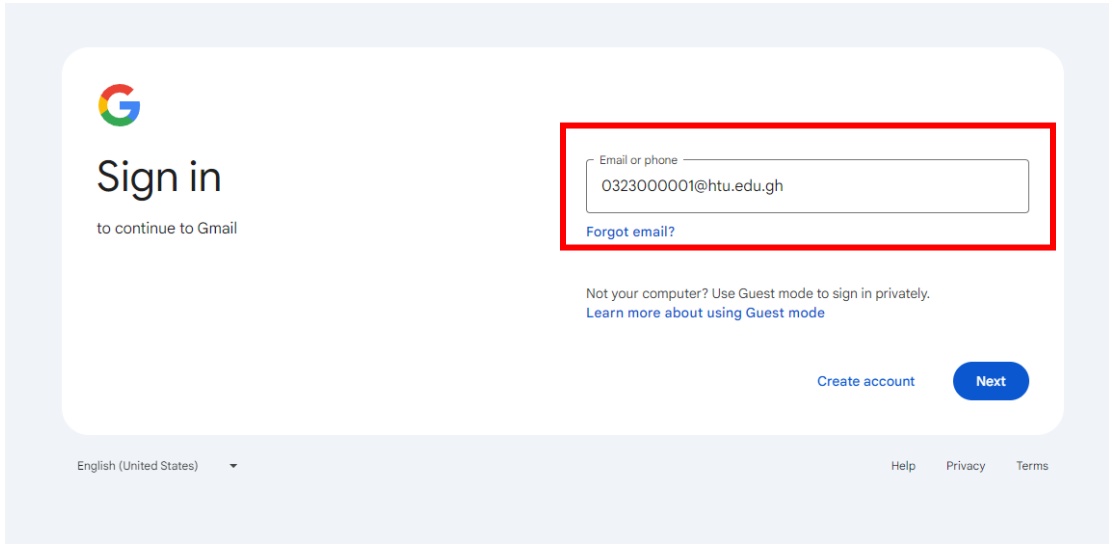
STUDENT EMAIL LOGIN PROCESS

1. Open any web browser and type: <https://www.google.com/gmail> in the address bar
And click on **Sign In**

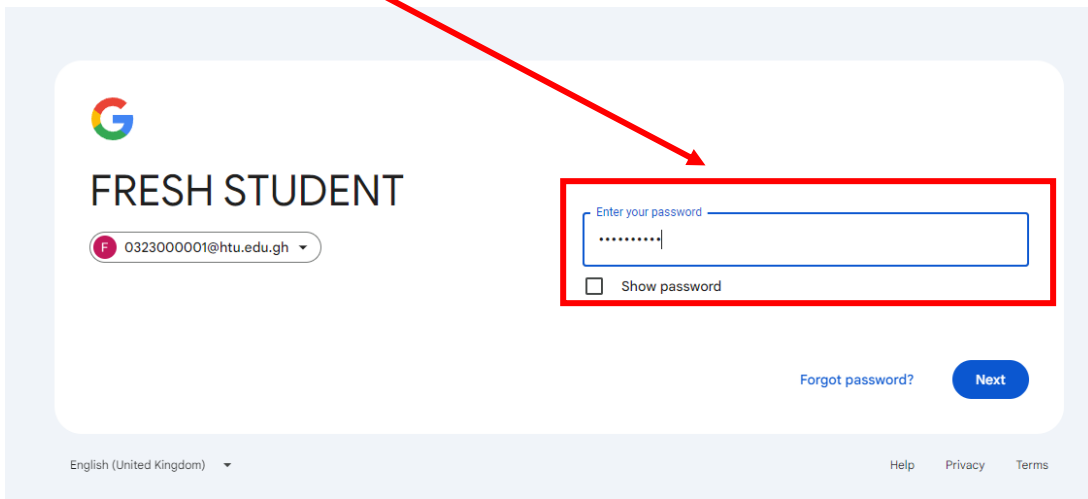


2. Type you login credentials given to by the Institution;

Password: Index Number

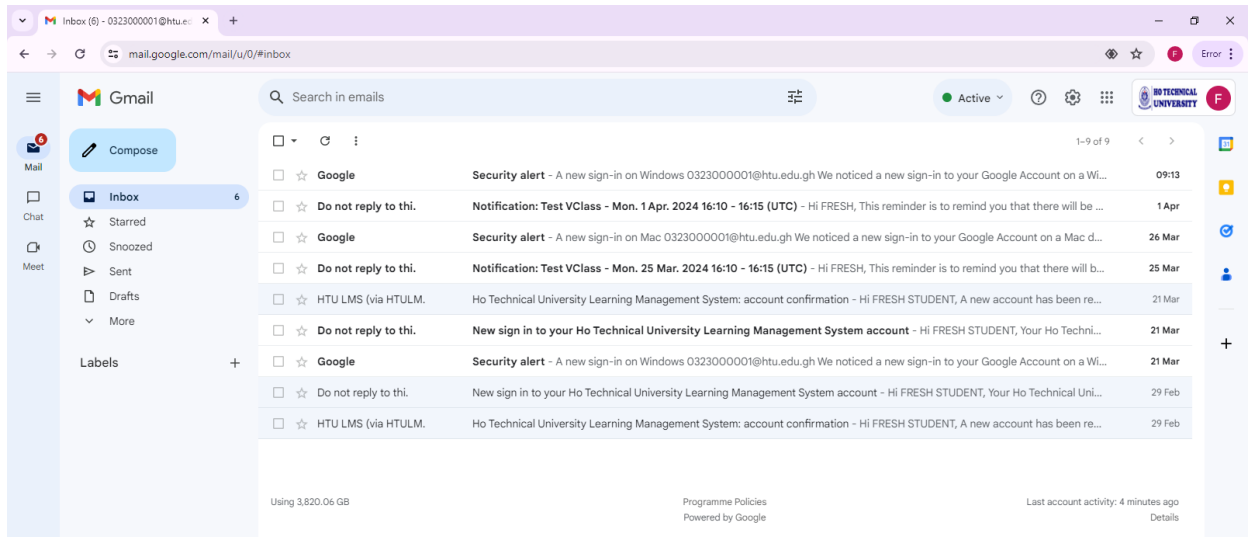

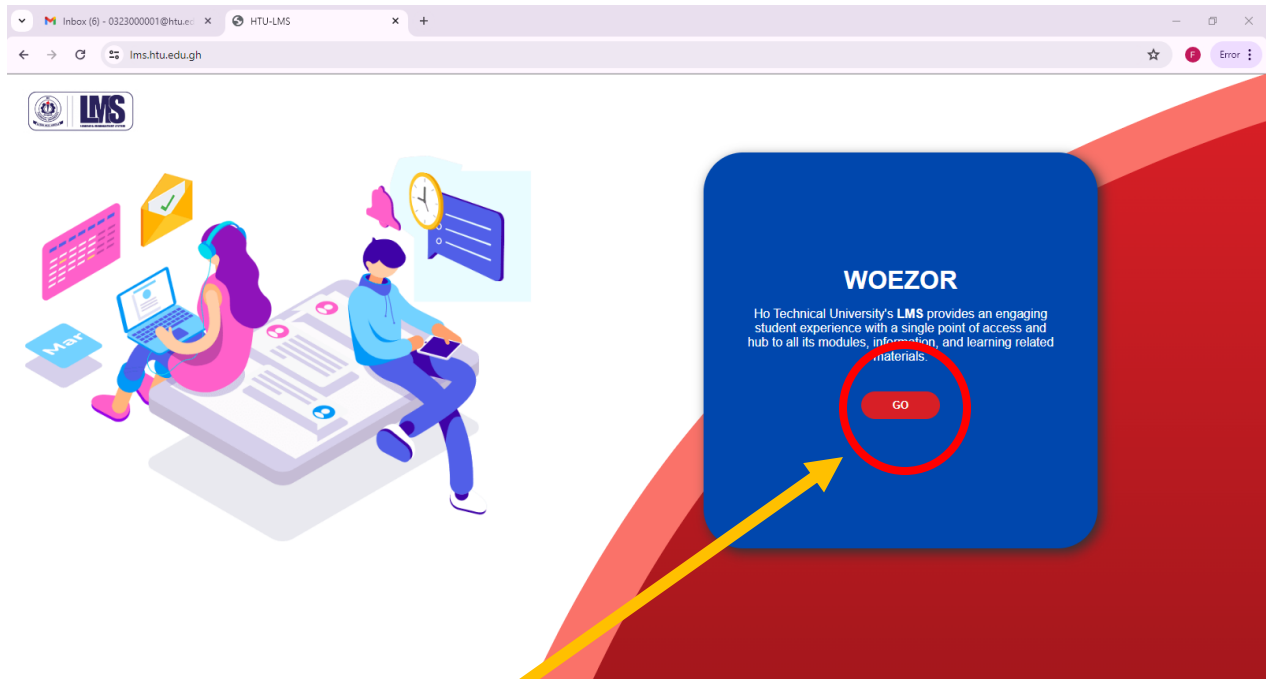
After a successful login, you can now access your email interface.

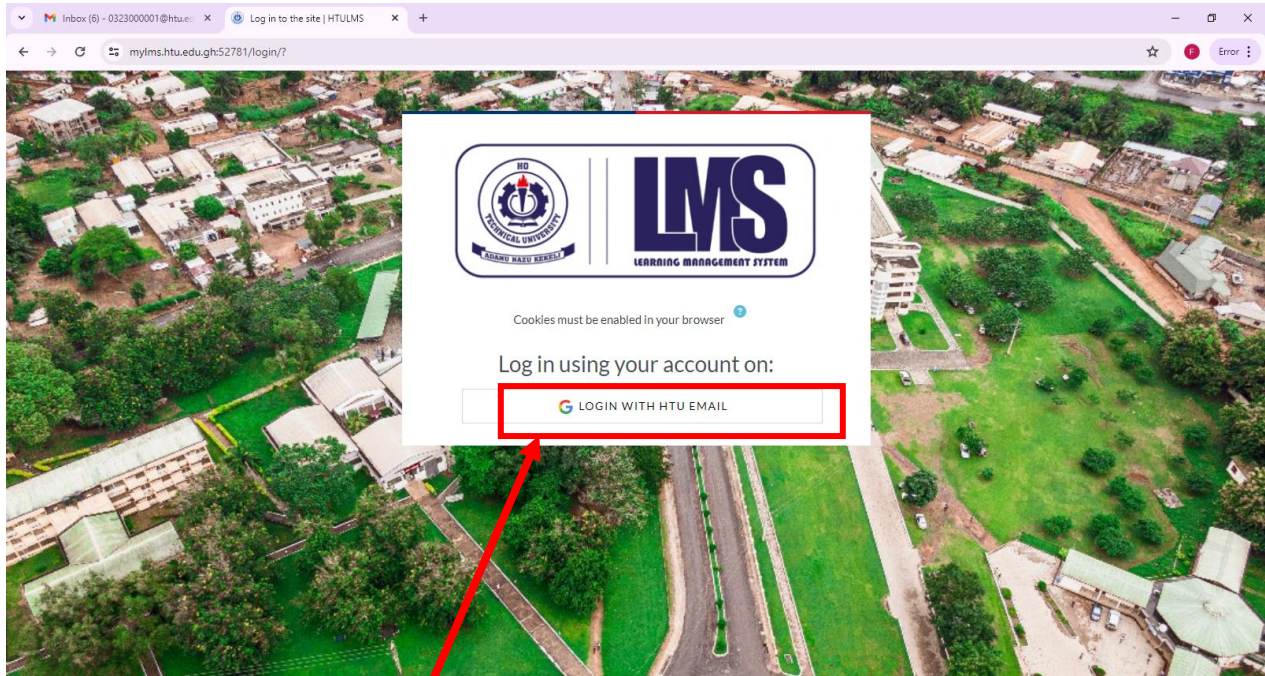
HTU LMS LOGIN PROCESS

Click on the GO Button to proceed

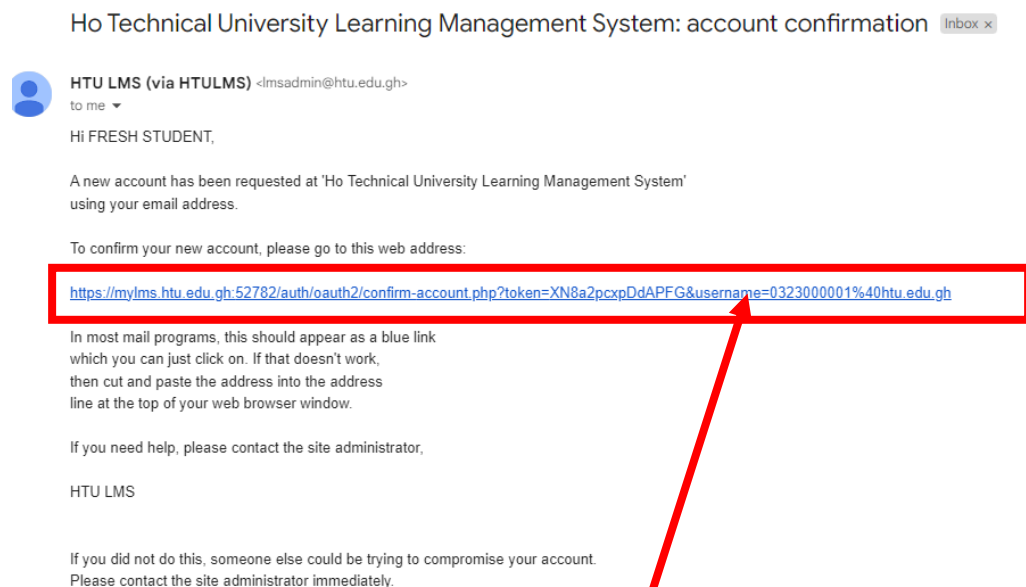
Next thing you see is the login interface which comes with no username and password.

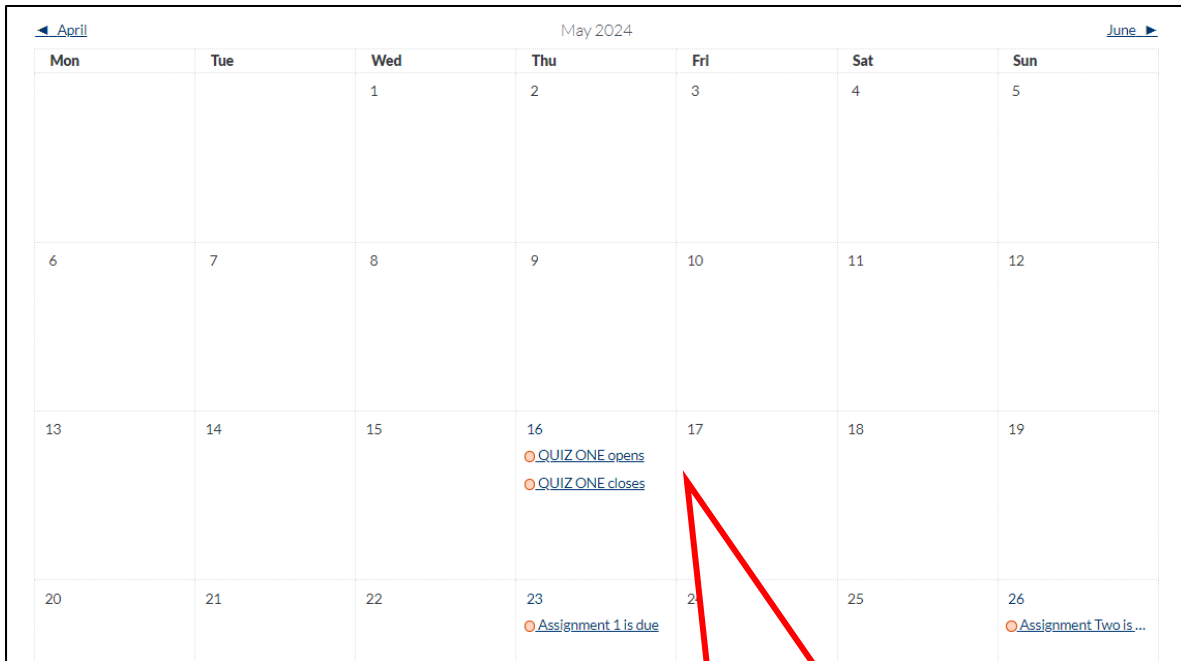

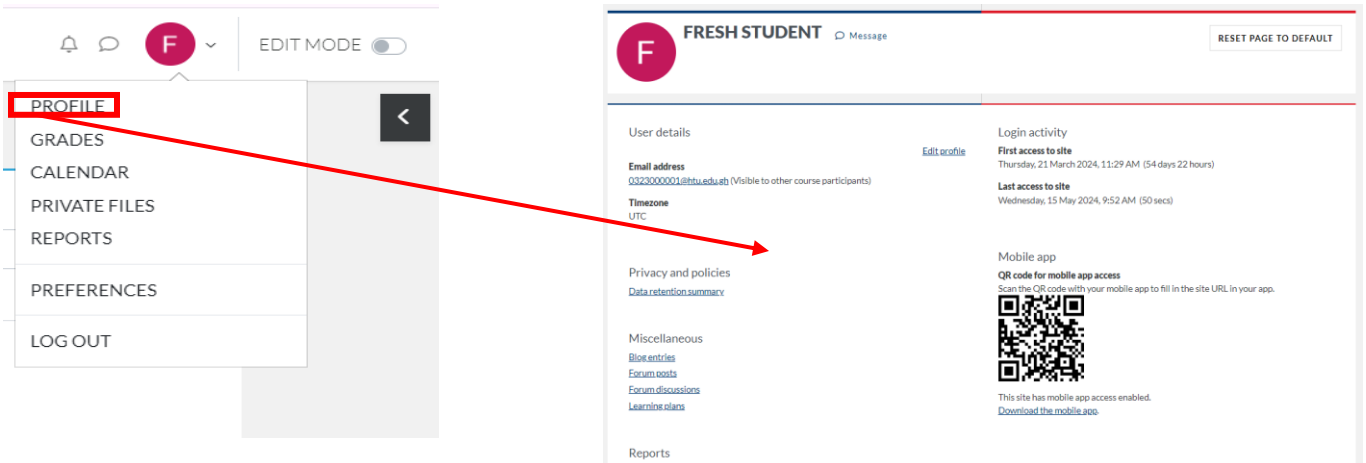
