BRIEF HISTORY OF HO TECHNICAL UNIVERSITY

Ho Technical University started as a Technical Institute in 1968 with the primary objective of providing pre-technical education. By 1972, the Institute upgraded its courses, resulting in the expansion of the pre-technical programmes courses in Engineering and Vocational fields such as Basic Engineering, Mechanical Agricultural and Engineering, Building Technology, Fashion, Hospitality Management and Business Education.

In 1986, the Institute became a Polytechnic. It however continued to operate as second cycle institution,

until 1993 when the Polytechnic was upgraded to a fully-fledged tertiary institution by the enactment of PNDC Law 321 and charged with the responsibility of training students in the technical and vocational skills to the Higher National Diploma [HND] level.

Subsequently, in 2007, Polytechnics were given the mandate by the Polytechnics Act 745, to award their own degrees to the highest level.

The passage of the Technical Universities Act 2016 (Act 922), as amended by Act 2018 (Act 974), gave

Ho Technical University the mandate to award degrees, diplomas, certificates and other qualifications to the highest level in Engineering, Science and Technology based disciplines, Technical and Vocational Education and Training, Applied Arts and related disciplines.



VICE-CHANCELLOR'S REPORT

INTRODUCTION

This report focuses on several key accomplishments and developments since the 23rd Congregation, held in February this year. This is on the thematic areas of the HTU Strategic Plan (2023-2027) namely; Teaching and Learning, Research and Innovation, Student Engagement and Experiences, Partnerships and Internationalisation, Governance and Institutional Development, Sustainable Infrastructural Development, and Financial Sustainability. The University is committed to providing a conducive environment for teaching, learning, research and innovation.

TEACHING AND LEARNING

Hospitality & Tourism Management (HTM) as Our Niche Area

The Department of HTM continues to train critical human capital for the hospitality and tourism industry and allied areas. Management is also working assiduously to secure funding for the construction of a Hotel School to deepen hands-on training in our niche area. The University is engaging relevant stakeholders to adopt some selected tourist sites in the Region to build the capacity of industry players to harness and enhance the benefits of these sites to our communities and the nation at large.





Retooling of Computer Laboratory

The first phase of the retooling of the Octagon Main Computer Laboratory has been completed. A total of sixty-one (61) computer monitors, sixty (60) thin-clients, two (2) CCTV cameras, one (1) server and related accessories have been installed to support effective teaching and learning in the University. Management will install four (4) additional CCTV cameras to enhance security surveillance at the Octagon.



Creation of SMART Classrooms with support from the Commission for TVET (CTVET)

In meeting the changing demands of classroom experiences, the creation of smart classrooms to advance teaching and learning has commenced. The University received and installed four (4) Avocado LED Smart Board Screens from the Commission for TVET (CTVET). The recordable LED Smart board screen is the latest generation of multimedia digital classroom product designed to enhance student learning experience. We are grateful for the Commission's support.



Commissioning of Mechanical Engineering Workshop (AVIC)

The Mechanical Engineering Workshop, retooled under the Government of Ghana AVIC Project was commissioned on Friday, 3rd February, 2023 by Prof. Yayra Dzakadzie, (Director for Tertiary Education), on behalf of the Minister for Education, Hon. Dr. Yaw Osei Adu Twum. The Faculty of Engineering and the Business Development Office have submitted a proposal on the commercialisation of these labs to deepen practical training and increase revenue generation for the University.



Fabrication Laboratory

As part of Erasmus Plus Project, Ing. Emmanuel Bani from the Department of Mechanical Engineering is scheduled to travel to Germany in November 2023 to acquire further training on the seamless operation and efficient management of the Fabrication Laboratory. The Lab. was established with the support of 250,000 Euros from the Rhine-Waal University of Applied Sciences (HSRW) in Germany. This is a joint research project between HRSW and HTU to enhance teaching and learning in selected departments.

Outreach Programmes

To improve enrolment, outreach teams embarked on admission programmes within the southern sector of Ghana. The Maiden Admissions fair was also held for final year students from Senior High and Technical Schools within the Region on 5th July, 2023 in the G.M. Afeti Auditorium to improve our admission intake.



Sensitisation Programme on the Utilisation of Nuclear Power in Ghana

A 2-day sensitisation programme for faculty and students on the utilisation of nuclear power in Ghana was held on 19th & 20th April, 2023 in the University. The programme was to create awareness and demystify the misconceptions about the use of nuclear energy as an alternative source of power. The University signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with the Nuclear Power Ghana (NPG) and the Ghana Atomic Energy Commission (GAEC) in September 2022, to commence academic programmes and to train the requisite human resources for the implementation of the nuclear power project in Ghana.



Restructuring of the University Library

Management has initiated plans to ensure that the University Library offers a variety of services aimed at enhancing research and student learning experience by improving and providing access to current learning materials such as books and digital resources. In fact, the necessary budgetary allocations have been made to address the various issues at the Library holistically in order to improve the general outlook and operations of the University Library. The contract for the supply of materials for an in-house production of additional shelves for the University Library has been duly awarded by Management. Also, Management has acquired two (2) Closed-Circuit Television (CCTV) cameras for the University Library as part of efforts to improve security at the library.

Inauguration of HTU Basic School Management Committee (SMC)

A School Management Committee (SMC) for the University Basic School has been inaugurated to oversee the operations and management of the school. The eight-member SMC, chaired by Dr. Ametefee Normanyo, was inaugurated on 20th March, 2023. The mandate of the SMC includes, formulating policies for the effective and efficient running of the Basic School, as well as advising the Headmistress and Vice-Chancellor on matters relating to the management of the School.

RESEARCH AND INNOVATION

Establishment of a Biomedical Engineering Centre of Excellence

The University is partnering with the Lucas-Nülle GmbH on a Skills Initiative for Africa (SIFA) project to establish a Biomedical Engineering Centre. The Centre will be dedicated to training and providing the requisite skills in the maintenance and repair of biomededical equipment within the healthcare delivery system in Ghana and the ECOWAS sub-region. The programme is aimed at improving the employability and competence of young people through hands-on training for the health sector.

The Baobab Project

The HTU baobab research project which has developed a new variety of baobab seedlings with a shorter maturity period of 27-months is receiving local and international attention. In this connection, Prof. Kenneth Egbadzor was invited by the Information Training & Outreach Centre for Africa (ITOCA) to participate in the 2023 Rapid Systematic Scoping Review Workshop in South Africa from 16th -18th October, 2023. Additionally, the University has received funds from the Spearhead Spirits company in South Africa, to support efforts in the conservation of baobab.

UDDT Project

Under the auspices of Faculty of Engineering, the Department of Civil Engineering organised a capacity building training programme for local artisans on 25th May, 2023 on the construction and maintenance of Urine Diverting Dry Toilet (UDDT). The training programme was part of the global initiative to eliminate open defecation by 2030. The participants included artisans, masons, carpenters, steel benders and plumbers among many others.

Improvement in Research Drive

As part of my vision to expand research of faculty from the cradle to an appreciable level, I am happy to report that HTU's publications in reputable databases such as Scopus and Web of Science has seen increasing annual growth.

Grantsmanship Training programme by Catalyste Plus

As part of efforts by Management to build the capacity of staff in grantsmanship, with sponsorship from Catalyste Plus, a training programme was held for various categories of Senior Members. Thie training programme was fascilitated by Prof. Angus Graeme, from 9th to 27th October 2023.

HTU Research Fund

The Applications Review Committee (ARC) of the HTU Research Fund has completed its work and submitted a report to the Research, Conference and Innovation Committee for further attention and onward disbursement of funds to qualified applicants.

Vice-Chancellor's Distinguished Lecture Series

The 5th edition of the Vice-Chancellor's Distinguished Lecture Series on the theme 'Becoming a Hub of Practical Education and Innovation, Advancing Sustainable Global Development: HTU in Perspective' was held on 4th May, 2023, at the G. M Afeti Auditorium. The annual lecture forms part of efforts to deepen academic experiences for the University Community and beyond. It is also aimed at educating participants on relevant topical issues, providing new insights, challenging the status quo and generating new ideas for future research. The Guest Speaker for the 5th Edition of the Vice-Chancellor's Distinguished Lecture Series was Prof. James Hawkins Ephraim, a renowned Chemical Engineer and the current Vice-Chancellor of Catholic University of Ghana.



Industry-Academia Lectures

The second edition of the Industry-Academia Lectures on the theme "Application of Agritech to Improve Food Production" was held in the University on 24th August, 2023 in partnership with the Institute of ICT Professionals Ghana and AFOS Foundation. The complex challenges of the current labour market dynamics and its associated demands enjoin students to reflect on the realities of the labour market during their participation in such lectures as they serve as career guides beyond the textbooks, classrooms and workshop training.

The 5th Edition of HTU/GOIL - CIMG Entrepreneurial Marketing and Innovation Awards

The 5th Edition of the HTU-CIMG/GOIL Entrepreneurial, Marketing and Innovation Awards was held in the University on 17th May, 2023, at which JB'S TECH emerged as the overall winners of the pitching event with their innovative energy metres. JB'S TECH was awarded a cash amount of GH¢ 10,000.00 to support their project. The project is targeted at solving bill-sharing challenges among households that share common electricity metres.



Participation in the World Skills Ghana Zonal Competitions

The University presented twenty (20) competitors for the 2023 World Skills Zonal Competitions which were held in Accra (Southern Zone) from 26th-29th June, 2023, and in Kumasi (Northern Zone) from 3rd-6th July, 2023. Out of the twenty (20) competitors, twelve (12) students from HTU have qualified to participate in the National Skills competition to be held in the later part of the of the year.



GOVERNANCE AND INSTITUTIONAL DEVELOPMENT

Improvement in Staff Profile

As part of efforts to improve staff and institutional effectiveness, some staff of the University were granted study leave and various forms of sponsorship to pursue further studies. It is noteworthy that some faculty have completed their PhD programmes and have returned and are poised to contribute effectively to the growth and development of the University. I wish to indicate that in 2019, the University had only fourteen (14) academic staff with PhD qualifiation. Currently, the University has over 60 academic staff with PhDs.

Promotion/Appointment of Associate Professors

The Governing Council at its 111th Regular Meeting held on 15th June, 2023, approved a recommendation from the University Appointments and Promotions Board to promote two (2) Senior Lecturers to the grade of Associate Professor in their respective Departments namely Prof. Kenneth Egbadzor and Prof. Maxwell Emmanuel Letsyo.

The purpose of the workshop was to enhance the efficiency and effectiveness of Academic Audit Teams in the discharge of their duties. Other Faculty and Staff were also supported to participate in various capacity building programmes.

A send-off programme was organised on 17th August, 2023 for forty (40) members of staff who retired between January 2019 and June 2023. HTU CLINIC

Human Resource and Logistical Needs

Management's engagement with the Ghana Health Service has resulted in the secondment of some staff to the HTU Clinic. A midwife and two (2) public health nurses have been deployed to the HTU Clinic by the Ghana Health Service. The University has also appointed some locum Nurses and Physician Assistants to augment the staff strength of the HTU Clinic given the growing patronage of the facility. A Health Service Management Committee of the University under the chairmanship of Prof. Maxwell E. Azila-Gbettor has also been constituted to oversee the management of the HTU Clinic.

Establishment of HTU Ultrasound Centre

The University has established an Ultrasound Centre furnished with the latest technology at the HTU Clinic with the support of the Ghana Association of Quasi-Government Health Institutions (GAQHI). An experienced Specialist has been engaged to manage the facility. The Ultrasound Centre was commissioned on 3rd October, 2023. The University is indebted to the Ghana Association of Quasi-Government Health Institutions (GAQHI) for their support to the University. Additionally, critical laboratory and diagnostic equipment have been procured and installed at the HTU Clinic to enhance health care delivery.

The University is making efforts to upgrade the HTU Clinic into a hospital and therefore appeals to all stakeholders of the University to support in the construction of an operating theatre and executive wards.



GENDER AFFAIRS OFFICE

2023 International Women's Day

The University celebrated the 2023 International Women's Day on Wednesday 8th March, 2023 on the theme "DigitALL: Innovation and Technology for Gender Equality". Prof. Takyiwaa Manuh, an Emerita Professor of African Studies served as the Guest Speaker for the event. She underscored the importance of educators, in encouraging young girls and women to acquire skills in the ICT and digital technology disciplines.



Commemoration of the 2023 Menstrual Hygiene Day

The University commemorated the 2023 Menstrual Hygiene Day on 2nd June, 2023 on campus. With support of the HTU Women in Engineering (WINE), sanitary products were distributed to adolescent girls at the HTU Basic School. In addition, teenage girls in the Basic School were educated on menstrual hygiene and its health implications. The Gender Affairs Office is commended for these efforts.



Free Cancer Screening Exercise at the HTU Clinic

In line with the University's commitment to fostering community development, the Gender Affairs Office in collaboration with the HTU Clinic, organised a free cervical cancer screening exercise for staff and the public. This is a typical example of the University's commitment to extending support to the public.



SUSTAINABLE INFRASTRUCTURAL DEVELOPMENT

Sod-Cutting Ceremony for Construction of AstroTurf Facility

In collaboration with the Ho Municipal Assembly, a groundbreaking ceremony was held on Sunday,October 8, 2023 for the commencement of an astroturf construction. The project been funded by the Ghana Gas Company is geared towards supporting recreational and sporting activities as well as harnessing talents of the youth in the Region. The facility was secured through the instrumentality of various stakeholders, including the Ho Municipal Chief Executive, Hon. Divine Bosson, Togbe Afede XIV, Madam Delphine Dogbegah, Board Member of Ghana Gas, and Management of Ho Technical University. The FIFA standard astroturf facility is expected to be completed within six (6) months.



Creation Laboratory and Offices for the Department of Agricultural Sciences and Technology

A new laboratory and offices have been created at the Afadzato Block for the Department of Agricultural Sciences and Technology, to augment existing ones to enhance effective teaching, learning, research and innovation.

Update on the Construction of the Upper Floor of the Department of Agricultural Engineering

The construction of an additional floor for the Agricultural Engineering Block is steadily progressing as part of efforts to provide additional lecture rooms and office space to enhance teaching, learning, research and innovation. The project, commissioned in 2022 is IGF-sponsored and the University will ensure its completion.

Landscaping and Beautification of the University Campus

The landscaping and beautification project being undertaken by the Directorate of Works and Physical Development to improve the general outlook of the university campus is progressing steadily in line with our core value of environmental sustainability. This is to ensure a conducive environment to foster teaching, learning and research.

To advance the collaboration of the University with the Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA), Mr. Evans Wilson Akpari, lecturer in the Department of Electrical/Electronic Engineering participated in an Industrial Automation Training programme in Malaysia from 16th -24th October, 2023. FINANCIAL SUSTAINABILITY

The current economic challenges coupled with the inability of students to honour their obligations on time, continue to impede the smooth operations and management of the University. Further, the financial obligations of the University to its stakeholders continue to increase. However, Management is adopting strategies to ensure prudent financial management of the University resources. For instance, production units are being reorganised and equipped to generate the needed Internally Generayed Fund (IGF) to support effective teaching, learning and research activities in the University.

INSTITUTIONAL/INDIVIDUAL AWARDS

To ensure that graduates of the University compare favourably with their counterparts worldwide, the University engaged in competitions that provided exposure for students. These competitions unearthed the competencies and skills of our students in addressing societal and organisational challenges.

Joy Prime Big Chef Tertiary Cooking Competition

The University participated in the Grand Finale of the Joy Prime Big Chef Tertiary Cooking Competition which was held at the SRC-JCR on Sunday, 1st October, 2023. HTU won the maiden edition of the Joy Prime Big Chef Tertiary Cooking Competition. The University was represented by three (3) students from the Department of Hospitality and Tourism Management, namely: Sandra Anyantson Akpedze, Elizabeth Nsanyan Binbime, and Godsway Agbedanu. Indebtedness of Students in the University

The high rate of student debtors in the University has become a matter of grave concern to Management and our Regulators. Following Academic Board's approval, Management is strictly implementing its fee-paying policy to compel students to pay their fees to be eligible to register and sit for end of semester examinations. Students are expected to pay their fees to access student services in the University.

Delays in completion of GETFund Projects

The delay in completion of GETFund sponsored projects in the University remains a challenge. However, we have been assured by GETFund that the projects would be completed to improve the general infrastructural needs and outlook of the University.

Absence of a Teaching Hotel

The University urgently needs a 20-Room Teaching Hotel to serve as a laboratory and Centre of Excellence for training of students and other interested stakeholders in our niche and allied areas.

Inadequate Residential Facilities for Students/Staff

The University needs additional residential facilities for students and staff. We therefore look forward to receiving feasible proposals from prospective investors who are ready to support the University in this regard.






















Employment Status of HTU Graduates


Type of Employment



How Long it took to get **Employed after Graduation**




