BRIEF HISTORY OF HO TECHNICAL UNIVERSITY

Ho Technical University started as a Technical Institute in 1968 with the primary objective of providing pre-technical education. By 1972, the Institute upgraded its courses, resulting in the expansion of the pre-technical programmes into courses in Engineering and Vocational fields such as Basic Engineering, Agricultural and Mechanical Engineering, Building Technology, Fashion, Hospitality Management and Business Education.

In 1986, the Institute became a Polytechnic. It however continued to operate as second cycle institution, until 1993 when the Polytechnic was upgraded to a fully-fledged tertiary institution by the enactment of PNDC Law 321 and charged with the responsibility of training students in the technical

and vocational skills to the Higher National Diploma [HND] level.

Subsequently, in 2007, Polytechnics were given the mandate by the Polytechnics Act 745, to award their own degrees to the highest level.

The passage of the Technical Universities Act 2016 (Act 922), as amended by Act 2018 (Act 974), gave Ho Technical University the mandate to award degrees, diplomas, certificates and other qualifications to the highest level in Engineering, Science and Technology based disciplines, Technical and Vocational Education and Training, Applied Arts and related disciplines.

INTRODUCTION

The 25th Congregation report highlights vital developments and outstanding accomplishments since the last Congregation, which was held on 18th November 2024.

The various activities are organized according to the thematic areas of the HTU Strategic Plan (2023-2027), namely: Teaching and Learning, Research and Innovation, Student Engagement and Experiences, Partnerships and Internationalisation, Governance and Institutional Development, Sustainable Infrastructural Development, and Financial Sustainability.

The Governing Council, Academic Board, and Management remain committed to providing students with an outstanding educational experience, ensuring they achieve remarkable results by the time they complete their studies in the University. To uphold this commitment, the University continues to offer the essential resources needed to promote quality teaching, facilitate effective learning, and provide the necessary supervision for all students.

TEACHING AND LEARNING

Hospitality & Tourism Management (HTM) as the University Niche Area

The Department of Hospitality and Tourism Management (HTM) is firmly committed to the development and training of vital human capital for the thriving hospitality and tourism sectors, as well as related industries. With an emphasis on delivering a high-quality education, Management is actively engaged in efforts to secure funding for the establishment of a state-of-the-art Hotel School. This facility will offer comprehensive, hands-on training tailored specifically to the demands of the hospitality industry, equipping students with practical skills and real-world experience. In addition, the University is currently in discussions with key stakeholders to explore the possibility of adopting some selected tourism sites in the Volta Region. This strategic move aims not only to bolster the educational and training capabilities of the Department of HTM but also to significantly enhance the capacity of these tourism sites. By improving infrastructure and resources, the University intends to maximize the benefits for local communities, promoting sustainable tourism that can contribute to economic growth and development both at the community and national level.

New Programmes

The University received approval from the Ghana Tertiary Education Commission (GTEC) to introduce new academic programmes. This includes the following:

- 1.MSc. Agricultural Sciences and Technology
- 2.MSc. Hospitality and Tourism Management
- 3.BA. Communication and Applied Media Technology
- 4.B.Tech Biomedical Engineering,
- 5.BSc. Accounting (Finance and Taxation options)
- 6.BSc. Financial Services (Banking and Finance & Finance and Insurance options)
- 7.BSc. Economics and Innovation
- 8.BSc. Architectural Technology

With the introduction of these new programmes, the Academic Departments have successfully launched at least one bachelor's degree programme. This is a remarkable achievement for the University, reflecting the evolution from zero direct degree programme to over 27 diverse bachelor degree programmes. The University is dedicated to continuously improving academic programme offerings to better serve students and meet the demands of the ever-changing job market.

Update on Fabrication Laboratory at HTU

As part of the international collaboration and joint research project initiatives, the Rhine-Waal University of Applied Sciences (HSRW) in Germany supported Ho Technical University in establishing a 250,000 Euro Fabrication Laboratory (Fab Lab) to enhance teaching and learning in selected departments of the University. The Fab Lab was officially inaugurated on 18th September, 2024, by Prof. Kingsley Nyarko, the Deputy Minister for Education in charge of Technical and Vocational Education and Training (TVET), who represented the Honourable Minister for Education. A high-level delegation from the Rhine-Waal University of Applied Sciences, along with representatives from the German Academic Exchange Service (DAAD) and several other dignitaries, were in attendance. It is noteworthy, that, some faculty and staff had already participated in capacity-building training programmes in Germany with the focus on the operation and management of the facility. Additionally, an academic staff has been nominated to travel to Germany in December 2024, for further training on the use and operations of the facility.

Retooling of Welding Laboratory

The University is upgrading its Welding Laboratory by incorporating modern equipment, designed to significantly improve teaching and learning experiences for faculty and students. This retooling initiative is aimed at providing students with hands-on training using the latest technologies and methodologies in welding, which are essential for their future careers in industry. The project is being made possible through the support of the Commission for Technical and Vocational Educational Training (CTVET). By investing in these critical resources, the University is ensuring that its curriculum remains relevant and is aligned with industry standards, ultimately fostering a more competent workforce in the field of Welding, Design and Manufacturing.

Resourcing of the University Library

Management is dedicated to enhancing the research and student learning experience at the Library. This includes providing a variety of services and improving access to current materials, such as books and digital resources. To achieve these objectives, Management had made strategic budgetary allocations that specifically target critical issues identified in its operations. These funds are aimed at upgrading technological infrastructure, expanding the collection of both physical and digital resources, and enhancing user services. It is believed that these improvements will significantly enrich the research and learning environment. Furthermore, Management would like to take this opportunity to express its heartfelt gratitude to stakeholders including faculty and staff who generously supported the

University Library during the period under review. Their ongoing contributions, including the donation of books and related resources, play a vital role in bettering the collection and fostering a collaborative academic community.

Retooling of Cosmetology Laboratory

The Cosmetology Laboratory is undergoing significant renovations and retooling with funds from the Internally Generated Fund (IGF) of the University. This improvement is aimed at enhancing the learning environment and practical experience for students pursuing careers in the field of cosmetology. The University invites you to explore and take advantage of the wide-range of services offered at the Cosmetology Laboratory.

Procurement of Classroom Furniture

In an effort to improve the learning environment on campus, the University has procured an additional 300 pieces of classroom furniture. This initiative aims to address the increasing demand for adequate seats in lecture halls to enhance comfort and functionality of the classroom experience for students and faculty. The newly acquired furniture had been deployed in two of the larger lecture halls situated within the new Agricultural Engineering Block of the University. This investment is part of Management's commitment to providing facilities that support academic excellence.

Acquisition of new Drafting Tables

The University has acquired an additional fifty (50) drafting tables to enhance educational resources of the Department of Fashion Design and Textiles. The decision to procure these drafting tables stemmed from the Vice-Chancellor's proactive engagements with the various Faculties and Schools on campus. During these discussions, Faculties and Schools were encouraged to identify and articulate their critical resource needs. The introduction of these drafting tables is expected to significantly improve the creativity and technical skills of the students. This initiative further reflects Management's commitment to investing in quality education and responding to the evolving needs of its academic programmes.

New Lab Equipment for the Department of Food Science & Technology

The Department of Food Science and Technology had acquired a new set of laboratory equipment and apparatuses to enhance students' practical sessions. The items include a digital thermostatic water bath, digital alcoholmeter, chromatography column, hand-held refractometer, filtering funnel, hand pump, and various lab consumables. Faculty and staff of the Department of

Food Science and Technology are commended for their thoughtfulness in complementing Management's efforts to retool laboratories on campus. Their foresight and commitment to fostering a rich educational environment will undoubtedly enhance the practical skills and knowledge of students, preparing them for successful careers in the food science industry.

Retooling of Computer Laboratories at the Octagon

In response to the growing demand for enhanced technological resources, Management has taken significant steps to improve the facilities at the Octagon. After successfully establishing the main Computer Lab, the University further procured additional computers and essential accessories aimed at creating a state-of-the-art Digital Lab within the Department of Computer Science. This new Digital Lab is designed to support a comprehensive teaching and learning environment, catering not only for the needs of Computer Science students but also to faculty and students from other related disciplines in the University. The Digital Lab will feature advanced computing resources and software tools that facilitate innovation and research, providing an engaging space for collaborative projects and hands-on learning.

Outreach Programmes

As part enrolment drive of the University, Management had established dedicated outreach teams tasked to conduct a series of admission outreach initiatives across the country. These teams were composed of faculty and staff, who actively engaged with prospective students and their families to promote the academic programmes the University offers. The outreach programmes include interactive school visits, and participation in educational fairs, where the teams presented the unique advantages of pursuing their studies at HTU. The success of these initiatives is reflected in the notable increase in the admission enrolment over the recent academic cycle.

Second Edition of HTU Admissions Fair

The second Admission Fair was held on 12th June, 2024 on the University campus. This event was designed to engage students from various Senior High Schools across the Region, offering them a comprehensive overview of the academic programmes available at HTU. Attendees had the unique opportunity to interact directly with faculty and staff who were available to discuss the diverse fields of study and answer questions about the curriculum. Moreover, students participated in informative sessions that highlighted the benefits of pursuing their education at HTU, including the University's state-of-the-art facilities, research opportunities, and support services. Overall, the event created an inviting atmosphere where prospective students felt encouraged

to envision their academic dreams and future at HTU.

31st Matriculation Ceremony of the University

The 31st Matriculation Ceremony of the University was held on 23rd February, 2024, marking a significant milestone in the history of the University. A total of 3,701 new students were matriculated. The event, which was held in two separate sessions, was well-attended by Management Officers, Deans, Directors, Heads of Department, Convocation, and students.

24th Congregation of Ho Technical University

The 24th Congregation Ceremony of Ho Technical University was held on 18th November, 2023, at the G.M. Afeti Auditorium. A total of 1,154 graduates received various degrees and diplomas. Prof. Yakra Dzakadzie, Deputy-Director General of the Ghana Tertiary Education Commission who represented the Sector Minister at the Ceremony, highlighted government's commitment to using Technical and Vocational Education and Training (TVET) as a catalyst for the country's transformation. The occasion was further enriched by the presence of Mrs. Evelyn Fortitude-Tekpor, a distinguished alumna of Ho Technical University and the CEO of Enyo Farms, who served as the Guest Speaker. In her address, she shared her inspiring journey from a student at the University to a successful entrepreneur, motivating the graduates to embrace challenges and pursue their dreams with tenacity.

2024 Faculty Week Celebrations

The Faculty of Art and Design celebrated its Faculty Week from 22nd -27th July, 2024, on the theme "Trend Shock/Classic Ethos: A positive transitory in Fashion and Art Exploration". As part of the celebrations, there was an Art and Fashion awareness procession through the principal streets of Ho, Seminar, games and a Fashion Show. Also, under the auspices of the Faculty of Applied Sciences and Technology, the Department of Computer Science organized an IT Week Programme. Some key activities which were undertaken during the Week Celebration, include free systems repairs and IT systems exhibitions. Further, the Faculty of Engineering celebrated their Faculty Week on 30th July, 2024, on the theme: "Reverse Engineering: A Catalyst for Innovation towards National Development". There were various exhibitions to commemorate the Faculty Week Celebrations which were held during the period. The overall success of these events lend credence to the Institution's commitment towards innovation and hands on training of our students.

HTU as Focal Institution for the ECOWAS Regional Certification

Scheme for Sustainable Energy Skills in Ghana

Ho Technical University (HTU) has been appointed as the Focal Institution for the ECOWAS Regional Certification Scheme for Sustainable Energy Skills in Ghana. RESEARCH AND INNOVATION

Update on Establishment of a Centre of Excellence in Biomedical Engineering at HTU

Ho Technical University, in partnership with the Lucas Nulle Group in Germany had won a two million one hundred and forty eight thousand fifteen Euros (€2,148,015) Call for proposals from the Skills Initiative for Africa (SIFA) to establish a Biomedical Engineering Centre. The contract has been signed and the project aims to provide hands on training in the maintenance and repair of Biomedical equipment. This will enhance the employability of young people in the biomedical engineering field as Ghana faces a significant demand for Biomedical Engineers.

The project further aims to bridge the existing gap caused by the shortage of skilled and qualified professionals in the sector. The Biomedical Engineering Centre will focus on equipping students not only with theoretical knowledge but also with practical skills necessary to effectively address the pressing healthcare challenges faced by the country and the broader ECOWAS sub-region. By training a competent workforce capable of maintaining and repairing biomedical equipment, this initiative will play a vital role in improving healthcare delivery and ensuring that medical facilities are adequately supported with the necessary technical expertise. This strategic investment in education and skills development is expected to make a lasting impact on the healthcare landscape in Ghana and beyond.

Update on the UNIDO Circular Economy Centre Project at HTU

The University hosted the grand inauguration of the UNIDO Ghana Circular Economy Center on 23rd October, 2024. This significant initiative is designed to boost socio-economic development by promoting environmentally sustainable practices that are in harmony with the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). The event brought together a diverse group of attendees, including high-ranking officials from the United Nations Industrial Development Organisation (UNIDO) based in Austria, the Hon. Minister for Environment, Science, Technology and Innovation (MESTI), as well as various dignitaries from academic institutions, industries, and civil society organizations.

The Centre aims to serve as a hub for innovation and collaboration, encouraging the adoption of circular economy principles across various sectors. By focusing on waste reduction, enhancing resource efficiency, and encouraging sustainable production and consumption patterns, the project aspires to foster a culture of sustainability that will ultimately contribute to both local and

national economic growth while protecting the environment. The discussions and presentations during the inauguration highlighted the crucial role that collaboration between government agencies, educational institutions, and international organisations play in achieving these ambitious goals.

Launch of Innovate for Employment and Innovate Launch Projects by ESDEV Foundation Africa

The University in partnership with ESDEV Foundation Africa launched two initiatives; "Innovate 4 Employment" and "Innovate Launch," on 6th November, 2024. The initiatives which were launched at the G.M. Afeti Auditorium, aimed at equipping students with the skills and resources to turn their innovative ideas into successful businesses. This collaboration is a significant step in HTU's goal to promote innovation and entrepreneurship. The initiatives will provide students with access to funding, mentorship, and training to help them develop their business concepts, contributing to economic growth and job creation in the area. The event was graced by the presence of Prof. Francis Owusu-Mensah, the CEO of ESDEV Foundation Africa, and Togbe Adu-Bobi IV, Afetorfia of Ho-Bankoe, who represented Togbe Afede XIV. Several distinguished guests including industry leaders, academics, and other stakeholders, attended the launch, along with faculty, staff, and students from the University.

The 6th Vice-Chancellor's Distinguished Lecture Series

The 6th Edition of the Vice-Chancellor's Distinguished Lecture Series took place on 18th September, 2024, focusing on the theme "Stimulating Technological Innovations in Technical Universities in Ghana: Lessons from the Rhine-Waal University of Applied Sciences in Germany." This important event aimed to explore the role of technological advancements in enhancing the educational landscape of technical universities across Ghana. The Guest Speaker for this prestigious lecture was Prof. Dr. Matthias Kleinke, a renowned expert from the Rhine-Waal University of Applied Sciences in Germany. His insights on the practices and strategies employed by the Rhine-Waal University of Applied Sciences provided valuable lessons and actionable ideas for fostering innovation within Ghanaian institutions.

Maiden Alumni Lecture

The maiden HTU Alumni Lecture was held on 12th August 2024 at the G. M. Afeti Auditorium. The highlight of the event was an address by Major General Kamal Ishola Yusuf, a distinguished alumnus of our University and a notable figure in the Nigerian

Armed Forces. His Lecture centered around the thought-provoking theme, "HTU, a Springboard to Global Leadership," through which he shared insights from his own journey and emphasised the critical role that education plays in cultivating leaders capable of making a global impact. The event drew an impressive audience, comprising Management Officers, Faculty, Staff, alumni, and current students of HTU, all of whom contributed to the enriching dialogue that ensued. Attendees expressed their appreciation for the opportunity to engage with Major General Yusuf, who not only inspired with his words but also encouraged the audience to embrace challenges and pursue excellence. As part of the event, Major General Kamal Ishola Yusuf was honoured by the University as its first alumnus who has attained the high rank of a Major General.

Update on Establishment of a Solar Technology Application Resource (STAR) Centre at HTU

In a significant step toward the promotion of solar energy technologies in Ghana, the University has entered into a partnership agreement with the Ministry of Energy and the International Solar Alliance (ISA) of India in May 2023. This collaboration aims to establish a Solar Technology Application Resource Centre (STAR C) at the Ho Technical University (HTU), which is poised to play a crucial role in advancing solar energy initiatives within the region. The procurement processes for the critical equipment needed to establish the Centre have been successfully completed, and the supply of these essential resources is currently underway. The STAR Centre will serve as a centralised hub designed to facilitate the dissemination of technology, knowledge, and expertise at both national and regional levels. The Centre will concentrate on four key functions: training, testing, innovation, and knowledge management, each playing a pivotal role in enhancing the capabilities of the stakeholders involved in the solar sector. This initiative is strategically designed to accelerate the deployment of solar energy technologies across the member states, ultimately stimulating economic growth and creating job opportunities within the renewable energy sector. The STAR Centre stands as a beacon of hope for the future of solar power in Ghana, fostering collaborations, promoting sustainability, and harnessing the vast potential of solar energy to drive national development.

Update on HTU Baobab Project

The HTU baobab research project which has developed a new variety of baobab seedlings with a shorter maturity period of 27 months is receiving local and international attention. The University is currently recognised by the Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO) of the United Nations for our efforts to promote baobab conservation. The Institution has also completed the necessary registration processes to become a member of the African Baobab Alliance. In addition, the University has

established an 8-acre baobab plantation funded by Spearhead Spirits in South Africa.

The Institution received grants from the University of Turku in Finland and Staffordshire University in the UK to support the HTU Baobab project. Just recently, the University secured 9,000 Euros from the Atmos Mare Shipping Company in Finland towards the cultivation of 2,000 baobab plants.

Further, the University is engaged in ongoing joint research projects with the Rhine-Waal University of Applied Sciences in Germany, among others. The impact and potential of the HTU Baobab project are significant. The Department of Industrial Art has already extracted yarn cords from the baobab plant. A team led by Dr. Harrison Adzimah had also brewed beer and wine from the baobab fruit, which is currently undergoing further testing.

Improvement in Research Drive of Faculty

The University is witnessing a notable improvement in its research visibility and output on key academic platforms like Web of Science, Scopus, and Research Gate. This upward trend is increasingly impactful, reflecting the institution's commitment to advancing knowledge and contributing to various fields of study. In particular, the number of research publications indexed in Scopus has seen remarkable growth. To illustrate, the University published only 4 articles in 2012, but this figure has surged substantially over the years, reaching an impressive total of 503 publications as of October 2024. This increase signifies a rise in research activity among faculty.

Update on HTU Research Fund

The University research fund established in 2022 has seen a significant stride, promoting and enhancing research and innovation across various disciplines. This fosters a robust research environment by providing financial support to research teams engaged in impactful projects.

These selected projects focus on addressing current challenges in their respective fields and are expected to contribute significantly to the enhancement of faculty research outputs and overall academic excellence. As part of the Management commitment to continuous improvement, the University is currently in the process of reviewing applications for the next batch of funding awards. This ongoing evaluation ensures that most promising research proposals that align with our strategic goals are identified and supported. Faculty is encouraged to stay informed about this initiative and consider applying in the next window.

Participation in the 3rd ARCTUG Conference

The University participated in the 3rd Annual Applied Research Conference of Technical Universities of Ghana (ARCTU-G), which

was held from 28th May to 1st June, 2024, at the Sunyani Technical University campus. The Conference, themed "University, Industry, and Government Partnership for Accelerating Innovation and Entrepreneurship for National Development," highlighted the critical role of collaboration and fostering an environment conducive to innovation and economic growth.

A significant highlight of the Conference was the participation of H.E. Nana Addo Dankwah Akufo-Addo, the President of Ghana, who attended as the Special Guest of Honour. In total, eleven (11) faculty from the University were sponsored to attend the conference. These participants engaged in various discussions, workshops, and presentations aimed at exploring the synergies between academia, industry, and government entities. They had the opportunity to network with experts and stakeholders, share research findings, and discuss strategies for enhancing collaborative efforts that can lead to impactful entrepreneurial activities and innovative initiatives across the nation.

Civil Engineering Students Innovate Flood-Resistant Building Design

A group of dedicated third-year students from the Department of Civil Engineering had made significant strides in developing a ground-breaking solution aimed at mitigating the impact of flooding in our communities. Having recognised the escalating threat of climate change and the urgent need to safeguard vulnerable populations from the devastating effects of flooding, these students, under the guidance of their Dean of Faculty and Head of Department, embarked on a project to create a resilient building design. Their innovative model is engineered with the unique ability to withstand rising water levels, making it a promising option for flood-prone areas.

The design incorporates buoyant materials and advanced structural techniques, allowing the building to adapt to surging water conditions. During rigorous testing phases, the prototype underwent simulations that replicated various flood scenarios. Remarkably, it demonstrated its capacity to float effortlessly, maintaining stability and structural integrity even in the most challenging conditions. This successful outcome validates the students' creative approach to structural engineering as well as throwing light on the real-world application of their work and providing sustainable relief to communities vulnerable to flooding.

The implications of their research are profound, offering a framework that could be utilised to construct flood-resistant infrastructure in areas that are frequently affected by natural disasters. Management, hereby, extends its heartfelt commendation to the entire faculty and the students involved in this pioneering project.

Innovative Contributions to Inclusive Mobility Solutions

As part of the Institution's commitment to fostering research and innovation that addresses societal challenges, two Master of Technology (MTech) students, Amatus Bigra Kuudening and Michael Dordor, under the supervision of Professors Richard Turkson and Maxwell Akple, have successfully designed and fabricated an Electric Vehicle (EV) tailored to the transportation needs of differently-abled individuals. This project underscores the dedication of the University to inclusive technological advancement. The EV is engineered to provide a practical, environmentally friendly mobility solution with several advantages over conventional vehicles. These include zero emissions, low operational costs, lightweight construction, and minimal maintenance requirements.

Maiden HTU Career Fair at HTU

The Career Fair was held from 7th – 8th August, 2024, bringing together sixteen (16) companies from various sectors, including banking, telecommunications, and recruitment. Approximately 1,000 students had the opportunity to engage directly with industry professionals, exploring career options and gaining insights into the demands of the professional world. Employers from companies such as Jobberman Ghana Limited, Ena Fashion, the Food and Drugs Authority, Ghana Water Company, and MTN interacted with students, offering valuable insights and advice. The two-day event served as a dynamic platform for students to explore potential career paths, connect with prospective employers, and understand industry trends and demands. Through one-on-one interactions with company representatives and panel discussions, students were equipped with essential skills for the world of work.

Internship Preparatory Seminar for Students

On 23rd May, 2024, the Directorate of Career Placement and Counseling organized an insightful one-day seminar aimed at preparing students of HTU for their upcoming internships and for navigating the professional world. This event served as a vital platform for students to acquire essential skills and knowledge needed in the workplace. The Director of Career Placement and Counseling, Dr. Edem Honu, who facilitated the engaging sessions focused on various aspects of the internship experience. Participants were introduced to topics such as crafting effective resumes, mastering interview techniques, and developing networking skills. The event also included interactive workshops featuring Q&A sessions, allowing students to gain practical insights from the various presentations. This initiative not only aimed to enhance students' readiness for internships but also sought to instill confidence as they prepare to enter a competitive job market. By equipping them with valuable tools and strategies, the seminar effectively aimed to bridge the gap between academic learning and real-world application, ensuring that students are well-prepared to embark on their career journeys.

Youth Empowerment & Entrepreneurship Summit at HTU

Inauguration of Mind Allies at HTU

The University has completed the necessary processes for the HTU Business School to be accredited as a member of the Association to Advance Collegiate Schools of Business (AACSB). The AACSB is an American professional and accreditation organization that provides quality assurance, business education intelligence, and learning and development services to over 1,900 member organizations and more than 1,000 accredited business schools worldwide. HTU is proud to be the third business school in Ghana and the only Technical University to be recognized by the AACSB.

Fulbright Specialist Programme (FSP) at HTU

The University has achieved a significant milestone by securing its first-ever Fulbright Specialist Project following a successful application and review process. Consequently, the University will host a Fulbright Specialist from January 2025 to implement several capacity-building programmes. In the long term, the Fulbright Specialist Programme (FSP) will foster sustainable collaborations, enhance the University's global reputation, and support its mission to develop highly competent human capital through career-focused education, skills training, research, and innovation in partnership with stakeholders. The Fulbright Specialist Programme, which is part of the larger Fulbright Programme, was established in 2001 by the U.S. Department of State's Bureau of Educational and Cultural Affairs (ECA).

Improvement in Staff Profile

The profiles of the academic staff of the University have shown remarkable progress over the years. In 2019, there were only fourteen (14) academic staff who possessed PhD. This number has significantly increased, to over 70 academic staff with doctoral degrees.

Furthermore, it is important to note that in 2019, the only member of the academic community holding a professorial position was the Vice-Chancellor. Today, the University has one (1) Professor and nine (9) Associate Professors who bring a wealth of knowledge and experience to their respective fields. This impressive growth underscores the University's commitment to enhancing the quality of education and research in the Institution. In line with the strategic goals of the University, Management is taking proactive measures to ensure that at least 80% of academic staff hold PhD by the end of the second term of the Vice-Chancellor. This target reflects the Vice Chancellor's personal aspiration for academic excellence for faculty and his dedication to providing students with a rich educational experience led by highly qualified professionals. This increase in senior academic positions does not only strengthen staff credentials but also foster an environment of mentorship and support for faculty and students.

Promotions & Contract Renewals

During the period under review, the University conducted a series of promotions aimed at recognizing and advancing the careers of deserving and qualified staff. These promotions were carefully assessed based on performance, contributions to the University community, and overall dedication to their respective fields. Additionally, there were some faculty appointments made to strengthen the academic team and enhance the quality of education offered. This includes the renewal of contracts for key staff members, ensuring that the University retains its most talented and hardworking individuals. This commitment underlines Management dedication to maintaining a high standard of excellence in education and service.

Staff Welfare

Upon assuming the role of a Vice Chancellor, one of the first initiatives undertaken was the establishment of a dedicated committee tasked with drafting a comprehensive welfare and provident fund policy specifically for the University staff. This policy aims to enhance the overall well-being and financial security of employees. However, there were some regulatory challenges encountered, particularly from the Ministry of Finance, which temporarily delayed the progress of work. Despite these hurdles, Management is actively engaging in discussions with several insurance firms. The goal is to develop a tailored welfare scheme that meets the diverse needs of all University staff members. In the coming days, we plan to invite the leadership of various Staff Associations/Unions to participate in evaluating the proposals that have been submitted. This collaborative approach will ensure that the welfare scheme is comprehensive and effectively addresses the concerns and needs of staff. Management is committed to transparency and inclusivity throughout this process and thus looking forward to working together to implement a robust welfare programme for faculty and staff of the University.

Capacity Building Workshops for Faculty/Staff

As part of the University's ongoing commitment to fostering professional growth and development among its faculty and staff, a series of capacity-building workshops and training programmes were organized. These initiatives aimed to enhance knowledge, improve skills, and promote best practices across the various Faculties in the University.

One important programme was the Academic Peer Review Reporting Workshop, organized by the Directorate of Planning and Quality Assurance for all faculties and schools on campus. This workshop took place from 29th-31st October, 2024, at the Amatrol Laboratory. The workshop was aimed at enhancing the skills of faculty in peer review while fostering a culture of constructive feedback and collaboration within the academic community.

Additionally, a comprehensive SMART Workplace (Office 365) Training session was conducted from 30th – 31st July 2024. This training was specifically designed for Administrative Staff, aiming to enhance their proficiency in utilizing ICT tools effectively within their daily operations. Participants explored the various features of the SMART Workplace, including collaboration tools, cloud storage, and communication platforms, which are vital for streamlining administrative processes and improving productivity across the University.

Another key event was the Competency Based Training (CBT) capacity building programme, organized by the Commission for Technical Vocational Education and Training (CTVET), which targeted Facilitators, Assessors, and Internal Verifiers within the University. This intensive training session was held from 27th – 31st May, 2024, at the Agricultural Engineering Block. The programme aimed to enhance the competencies of participants in delivering competency-based training and assessment, ensuring that they are well-equipped to meet the evolving needs of the educational environment.

Further, a Stress Management Workshop, which took place on 29th February 2024, focused on equipping participants with practical strategies to identify stressors and develop effective coping mechanisms in both personal and professional environments. Mr. Sedem Amedome, the Guidance and Counselling Officer led the session, engaging participants in discussions and activities designed to promote resilience and collective well-being.

In addition to these training workshops, faculty and staff were encouraged and supported to participate in various other capacity building programmes throughout the review period. This approach contributed to their professional development and also strengthened the academic and administrative effectiveness of the University. Through these initiatives, the University continues to invest in its human capital, ensuring a knowledgeable and skilled workforce capable of meeting the challenges of the future.

Send-Off Programme for Retirees

On 8th August, 2024, the University Management organized a send-off programme to honour the members of the staff who retired during the academic year. During the ceremony, each retiree was presented with a citation that highlighted their significant contributions to the growth and development of the University. SUSTAINABLE INFRASTRUCTURAL DEVELOPMENT

Construction of a Surgical Theatre at the HTU Clinic

The University unveiled and commissioned a surgical theatre of the HTU Clinic on 12th August, 2024. This marked a significant milestone in healthcare infrastructure for the community. The facility was made possible through the generous contributions of the Alumni who recognised its pressing need at the time. The theatre was commissioned by Major General Kamal Ishola Yusuf, the Chief of Defence, Accounts and Budget of the Nigerian Armed Forces who also served as the Guest Speaker for the inaugural Alumni Lecture of the University. The newly constructed surgical theatre encompasses a comprehensive suite of facilities designed to enhance surgical care and patient recovery.

Completion of the New Agricultural Engineering Block

The construction of the upper floor of the Agricultural Engineering Block and the remodelling of the entire facility has been completed. A brief ceremony was held on 10th April 2024, during which the facility was officially handed over to the University by the Contractor. It is important to note that the facility, which is an IGF-sponsored project, has two additional lecture rooms and fourteen (14) offices and workshops to enhance teaching and learning.

Update on Construction of 2-Unit Classroom Block at HTU Basic School

A 2-unit classroom block has been completed at HTU Basic School. The construction of the classrooms aimed at improving the learning environment for our pupils. This was an initiative of the Parent-Teacher Association (PTA), and supported by the University. The new classroom block was designed to accommodate a larger number of students, providing them with a comfortable and conducive space for teaching and learning activities. This project reflects the University's commitment to enhancing educational facilities and resources at the HTU Basic School. The 2-unit classroom block has been officially handed over for use.

Renovation of Old Library Block

Drilling and Mechanization of one (1) additional borehole by the HTU-SRC

PARTNERSHIPS & INTERNATIONALIZATION

Participation of Faculty/Staff in the 2023 Winter School/Training Programme in Germany

As part of the University's partnerships and internationalization strategy, the Director of Works and Physical Development, the Gender Affairs Officer and the Counsellor of the University participated in the 2023 Winter School on 'Inclusion in the Academic Context' at the University of Cologne, Germany from 1st-10th December, 2023. The trip and related events were funded fully by the partners and the State Chancellery of North-Rhine-Westphalia in Germany. This collaboration underscores Management commitment to advancing educational practices and also strengthens the institutional ties with international academic communities. Overall, this experience is expected to have a lasting positive impact on the University's approach to inclusion and equity in the academic landscape.

Update on Partnership with the Rhine-Waal University of Applied Sciences, Germany

Two (2) students of the University are actively participating in a student exchange programme at Rhine-Waal University of Applied Sciences in Germany. This student exchange programme began in September 2024 and is scheduled to end by February 2025. The participating students are receiving Erasmus grants, which cover not only individual support tailored to their educational needs but also travel grants that aid in offsetting expenses related to their journey. This initiative allows students to immerse themselves in a different academic environment, enriching their educational experience and enhancing their cultural understanding. In addition to the student exchange activities, Prof. Kenneth Egbadzor recently took part in a staff exchange programme at the Rhine-Waal University from 4th -14th June, 2024. During his time there, Prof. Egbadzor engaged in meaningful discussions and collaborations with partners of the University, focusing on advancements related to the HTU Baobab Research Project. These interactions are strengthening the partnership and also contributing significantly to the ongoing research and academic initiatives between the partner institutions.

Update on Collaboration with the University of Turku in Finland

Two (2) faculty namely Prof. Kenneth F. Egbadzor and Dr. Godwin S. A. Horlu had the opportunity to participate in a Faculty/Staff Exchange Programme in Finland as part of the Erasmus+ Project, specifically within the framework of Higher Education Mobility (KA171) from 20th October, 2024 to 6th November, 2024. During their time in Finland, they engaged in various academic and cultural activities, fostering

cross-institutional relationships and exchanging valuable teaching methodologies. The University looks forward to seeing the positive impact of this exchange programme and related research activities.

US Community College Initiative Programme

Three (3) students of Ho Technical University are participating in the 2024 US Community College Initiative Programme, which offers a unique opportunity for international students to enhance their educational and professional skills. This prestigious year-long scholarship programme will offer these students the opportunity to engage in a variety of enriching activities, including academic coursework, hands-on skills training, and comprehensive leadership development initiatives. Throughout their time in the United States, the students will not only attend classes at U.S. Community Colleges but also partake in practical work experiences that aim to deepen their understanding of their fields of study. The programme is designed to foster cultural exchange and personal growth, providing participants with the tools necessary to become effective leaders in their home communities upon their return. Overall, the US Community College Initiative Programme serves as a valuable platform for beneficiaries to broaden their horizons and acquire skills that are integral to their future success.

Update on Partnership with Ghana Navy

The University has entered into a partnership arrangement with the Ghana Navy for capacity building of its officers and men. The Graduation ceremony for the 2024 cohort of students from the Supply Application School (SAS) of the Naval Training Command (NAVTRAC) was held on 5th September, 2024 at Nutekpor.

Update on Partnership with Nuclear Power Ghana (NPG) and Ghana Atomic Energy Commission (GAEC)

Following the establishment of a partnership arrangement with the Nuclear Power Ghana (NPG) and Ghana Atomic Energy Commission (GAEC), some foundational courses and related curricula in Nuclear Science and Technology are being developed for implementation in the University. The goal is to implement these foundational courses by January 2025, fostering a new generation of professionals who are well-versed in the intricacies of nuclear technology and prepared to contribute effectively to the sector. Management is committed to maintaining high educational standards and ensuring that the curriculum reflects the latest advancements in the field.

NEW PARTNERSHIPS

Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with the Vanuatu Trade Commission (VTC)

The University has signed an MoU with the Vanuatu Trade Commission. This MoU aims to establish a collaborative framework between HTU and VTC to support academic collaboration, provide grants for research and infrastructure, and offer training for HTU faculty and staff in Artificial Intelligence (AI).

Partnership with T-TEL

The University is partnering with T-TEL to develop and implement a Regional Directorate Leadership Capacity Development and Coaching Programme for the Ghana TVET Service. This partnership and related project is focused largely on providing targeted leadership training, fostering professional development, and equipping the Regional TVET Directors with the skills necessary to effectively manage and lead their respective outfits. By enhancing leadership capacity, the initiative aims to improve the overall quality and relevance of technical and vocational education in Ghana, ultimately benefiting students and the broader workforce.

Partnership with ROGEAP ASPIRE

The University is partnering with ROGEAP ASPIRE to train and certify solar entrepreneurs and installers within the sub-region of Africa. The ROGEAP ASPIRE project, is being financed by the World Bank, the Clean Technology Fund (CTF), and the Government of the Netherlands. Successful candidates are expected to benefit from the following offers as part of the project:

-Customized preparatory training for established and aspiring solar entrepreneurs and installers

-Hands-on solar installer training in ECREEE-certified training centers

-Subsidized regional certification by 70% for selected women and youth participants to encourage increased skills in solar PV installation and address participation barriers to developing a regional ecosystem

-100% scholarship for the regional installer's certification for a selected number of women who meet the ECREEE scholarship eligibility criteria

-Access to ROGEAP entrepreneurship and financial support activities

Partnership with Harare Polytechnic

Ho Technical University (HTU) has formalized a partnership with Harare Polytechnic in Zimbabwe through the signing of a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU). This strategic agreement aims to enhance collaborative efforts in research initiatives and to foster career development programmes for faculty and students at each institution. The MoU was officially signed during the 2024 awar International Conference held in Kenya, providing a significant platform for academic collaboration in the region. This partnership is expected to facilitate knowledge exchange, strengthen academic ties, and provide valuable resources that support the professional growth of individuals within both universities.

Reorganization of Production Units on Campus

The University has commenced activities towards the comprehensive restructuring of the various Production Units located on campus. This initiative aims to enhance the generation of Internally Generated Funds (IGF) for the University, ensuring long-term financial viability and sustainability. An Ad-hoc Committee, specifically tasked with this critical endeavour, has submitted its detailed report to Management for further consideration. The report outlines proposed changes, operational efficiencies, and innovative strategies designed to optimize the performance of these Production Units. Management will evaluate the recommendations to ensure effective implementation in 2025.

INSTITUTIONAL / INDIVIDUAL AWARDS

2024 Agritech Challenge

The University participated in the 2024 edition of the Agritech Challenge, which was held on 17th and 18th May, 2024, in Accra. At the end of the grand finale, Desmond Ntim Anokye, Esther Akpalu, and Evelyn Yankson of Ho Technical University (with the brand name Deecom Nutrifooods) won USD 20,000.00 to implement and scale up their business. The team introduced a ground-breaking product known as "soysages," a nutritious alternative protein derived from soybeans. This innovative food product not only addresses the growing demand for plant-based protein sources but also highlights the potential of soybeans as a sustainable agricultural resource.

2024 Huawei ICT Competition

Ho Technical University emerged as the overall winner of the 2024 Huawei ICT Competition, which took place at KNUST in the last quarter of 2023. Over 1,000 students registered for the Huawei ICT Competition Network Track 2023/2024, with 561 students from various universities in Ghana participating in the preliminary round. From this group, 50 students qualified for the national level, including six (6) from Ho Technical University, who advanced to the regional level after excelling at the nationals. To represent Ghana at the inter-regional competitions, two groups were formed, each consisting of three (3) students. The first place and second runner-up positions for these groups were secured by students from the Computer Science Department of Ho Technical University,

while two (2) students from the University of Ghana's Computer Science Department placed second. As a result, Ho Technical University's Computer Science Department emerged as the winners at the national level of the competition.

Participation in Africa Regional Conference & Exhibition on Education and Skills Development (ARC-EDS)

HTU participated in the Africa Regional Conference & Exhibition on Education and Skills Development (ARC-EDS) which was held on 12th July, 2024, in Accra. CONCERNS/CHALLENGES

Stalled GETFund Projects at HTU

The delay in the completion of stalled GETFund projects on campus continues to pose a significant challenge. These projects are crucial for enhancing the general infrastructure and overall appearance of the campus, which in turn will benefit both students and faculty. Despite the setbacks, Management had received assurance from GETFund and Stakeholders that efforts were being made to expedite the completion of these projects. Their commitment to resolving these delays is expected to lead to improved facilities that will better support academic and extracurricular activities, ultimately fostering a more conducive learning environment in the University.

Absence of a Teaching Hotel

The University is facing a pressing need for the establishment of a 20-room Teaching Hotel, which will function not only as a practical training facility but also as a Centre of Excellence for the hospitality industry. This initiative would provide students, and other stakeholders, with hands-on experience and comprehensive training in the hospitality, tourism, and related sectors. By creating this Teaching Hotel, the University would be adding value to its niche area. The facility would serve as a vital resource for developing essential skills and knowledge in a rapidly evolving field.

High Cost of Teaching and Learning Materials

The escalating expenses associated with teaching and learning materials, as well as essential equipment and software, pose significant challenges to the University. Consequently, Management seeks the support of partners and stakeholders to help alleviate this financial burden. Collaborations and contributions in the form of funding, resources, or any other assistance would be invaluable in ensuring that both faculty and students have access to the necessary tools and materials to enhance their learning and teaching environments.

High Cost of Utility Bills

The rising cost of utility bills, particularly electricity expenses, poses a significant challenge to the University. This issue affects the operational budget and also impacts the ability to provide educational aids. We are reaching out for support and urging government intervention to help alleviate this financial burden. Additional Responsibility on the University to pay IGF-related

Allowances

The University faces an additional responsibility regarding the payment of IGF-related allowances to eligible faculty and staff. This obligation has proven to be quite challenging, particularly given our current fiscal and economic constraints. Despite these difficulties, we are implementing various strategies to tackle this issue. Our approach includes careful budget management, exploring alternative funding sources, and optimizing operational efficiencies to ensure that we can meet our commitments to staff while navigating the financial landscape effectively. We are committed to finding viable solutions that will enable us to fulfil our responsibilities without compromising the overall stability of the Institution.

Fencing of the University Campus.

The University has initiated the construction of a fence around the entire campus as part of our commitments to creating a safe and conducive learning environment. This initiative aims to address various security concerns such as unauthorized access, thefts, and other potential safety risks. Additionally, the fence will demarcate the campus boundaries and foster a peaceful atmosphere for academic and social activities. We are therefore appealing to individuals, year groups and various stakeholders to support us on this important project.

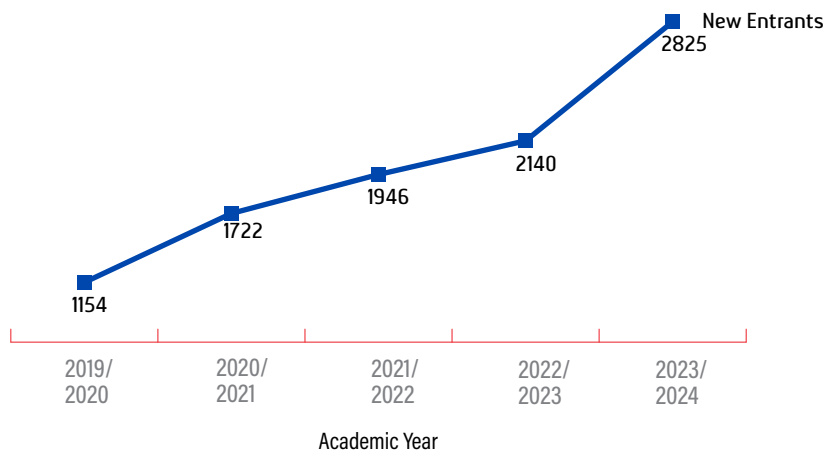

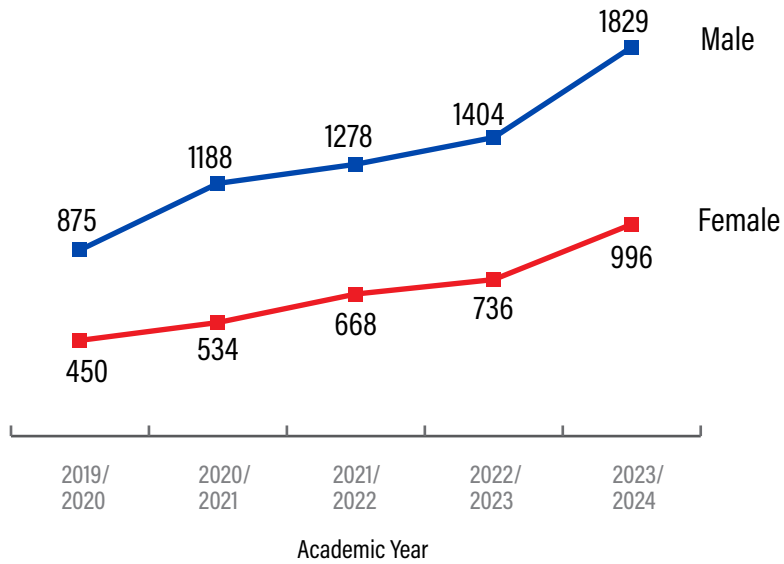

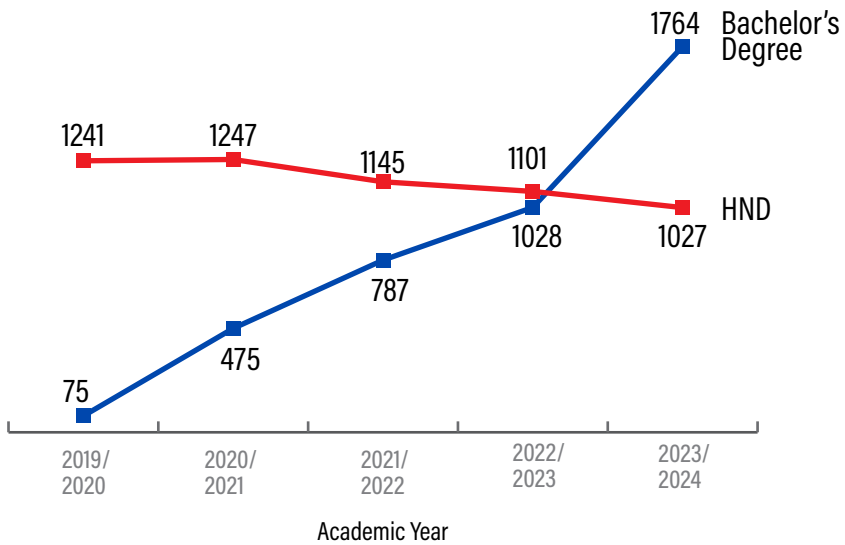
Admissions Trend by Sex

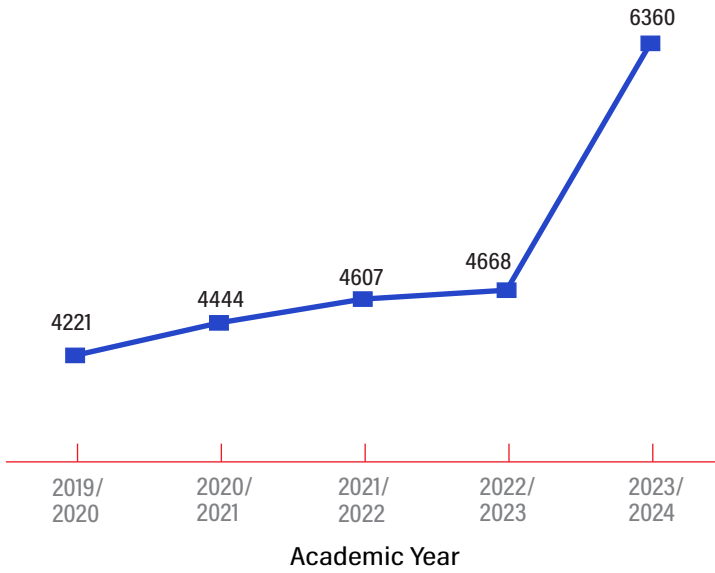

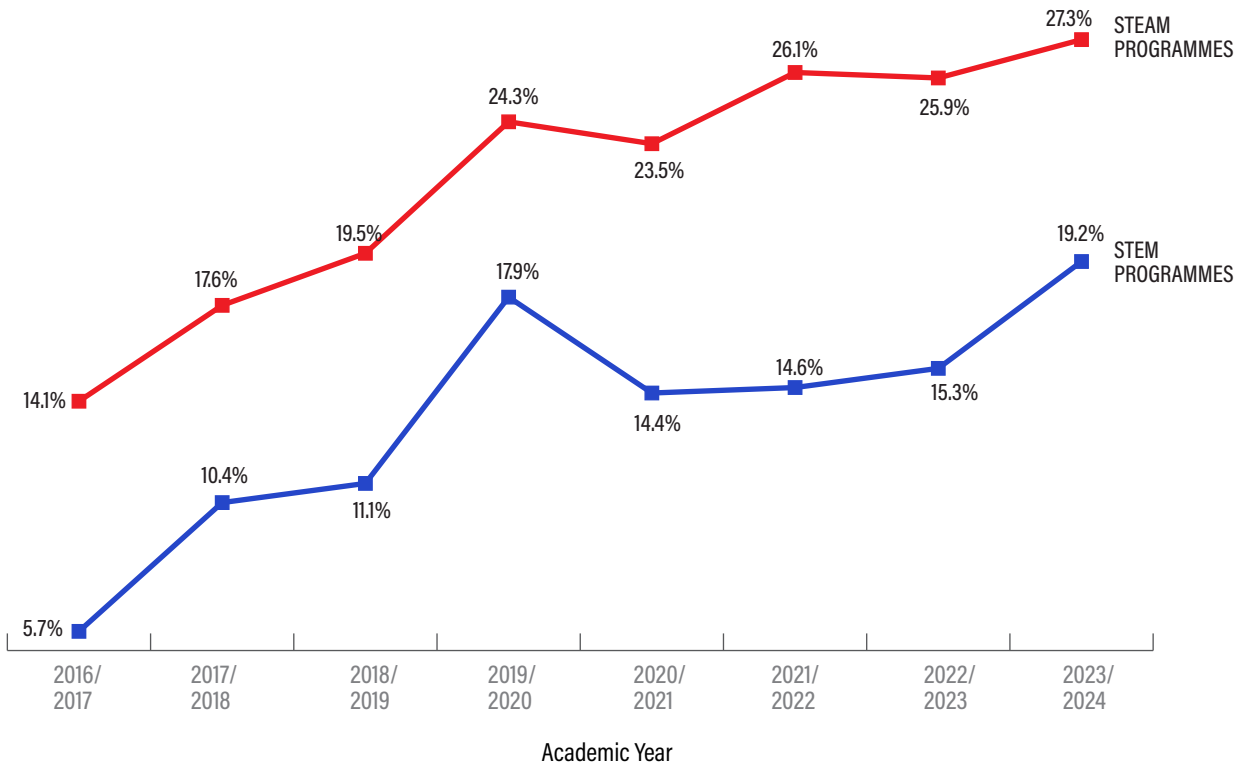

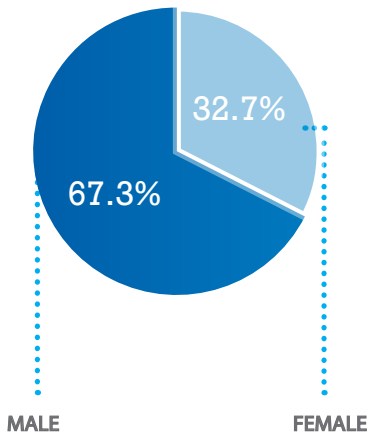
Performance of Graduates by Sex



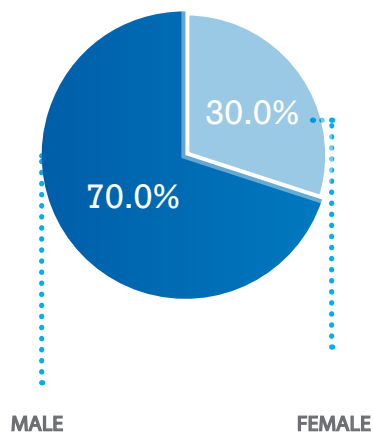

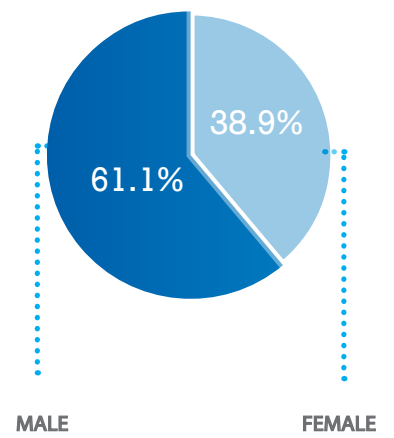

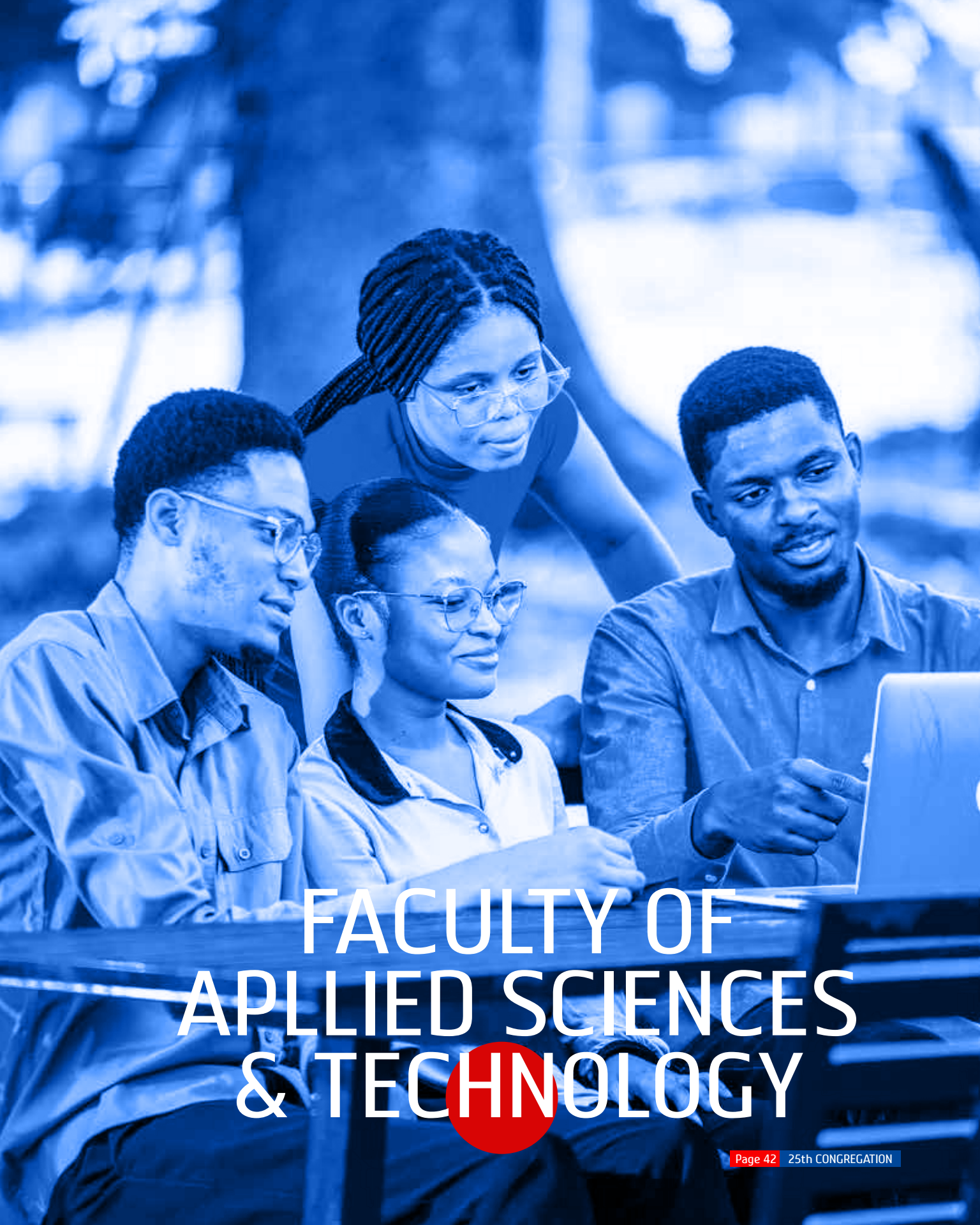
